


ANGELIQUE IS YOUR VACATION SPOT IN MAINE!

Designed *only* for windjamming and built for comfort, *Angelique* is swift and safe. Her deep draft hull and full keel assure maximum stability in any weather. Her steel and wood construction combine the authenticity of a classic 19th century North Sea fishing trawler with all the comforts of home.

Angelique boasts 3 "heads" (bathrooms) and 3 hot, freshwater showers below deck. There is standing headroom in all 15 guest cabins. Each well-ventilated cabin has its own freshwater sink, reading lights, towels, sheets, and blankets.

One of our guests' favorite spots is the deckhouse salon, a lounge above deck. The deckhouse is completely protected from the weather, with lots of windows to view the passing scenery. At night, the deckhouse is often the place for an old-fashioned songfest, as guests and crew alike circle around the piano and break out the guitars. Guests are always welcome to bring small musical instruments aboard!









FOOD ABOARD AND A MAINE LOBSTER BAKE

Meals aboard *Angelique* are served family style and are best described as gourmet comfort food. This includes roasts, pork loin, soups, stews, shipboard-baked pastries, fresh salads and seafood, and daily homemade breads. Bring your appetite because it's good food and plenty of it! Our chefs are busy in the galley from dawn to dusk cooking everything from scratch using fresh, quality ingredients, sourced from Maine farmers whenever we can. Special diets can be easily accommodated when advance notice is given.

One evening of the cruise, we will row ashore to an uninhabited island for a traditional Down East feast of lobster, burgers, and corn — cooked to perfection over an open fire on the beach. Top it off with homemade dessert and roasting s'mores over the fire. This famed all-you-can-eat Maine lobster bake is a highlight on *every cruise*!









A vacation aboard *Angelique* is an intimate and authentic Maine experience. From sailing on a tall ship to the traditional all-you-caneat lobster bake on an uninhabited island, you will be immersed in the 'real' Maine. The captain's local knowledge allows you to visit quaint, off the beaten path locations. During daily shore excursions, you'll have the opportunity to explore an island, hike in a nature preserve, walk to a lighthouse, or visit a historical village or small town to get a sense of Maine's local culture.
