

GRACE BAILEY was built in Patchogue, Long Island, New York, in 1882 by Oliver Perry Smith and named for owner Edwin Bailey's daughter, Grace, born that year. In 1906, GRACE BAILEY was rebuilt and renamed for Mr. Bailey's granddaughter, Martha, nicknamed Mattie. From 1906 until 1990, the schooner sailed as Mattie, but in the spring of 1990 after restoration was returned to her original name.

The vessel is framed and planked with white oak, with a deck of longleaf yellow pine. It carries no inboard engine. Propulsion when needed is provided by a small yawl boat with an inboard motor. She carries 1000 gallons of fresh water and is equipped with three public heads and a hot shower.

There is a centerboard with a centerboard trunk, the main mast being offset somewhat from the centerline of the hull to accommodate the width of the trunk. The only significant alteration to the schooner lies in the substitution of companion ways for cargo hatches and the installation of staterooms below decks.
